# WHEN THEY SEE US

When they see us, we get the looks of despair as if it's our fault that we grieve for our beloved parents and we had nowhere else to go. For some of us, our parents neglected and abused us, and they ended up in jail. Why didn't they love us enough? This is how our story began but I promise you, this is not where it ends.

These are the stories of transitional-age-youth (TAY), ages 16-25 that make up 16 % of the foster care system. According to the Children's Law Center, there are over 60,000 children in foster care and the number continues to increase. In 2010, AB12 (assembly bill) was signed, which extended foster care until the age of 21. This has changed the trajectory for many youth, however, there still remains a call to action for additional support. The TAY population are youth who leave foster care without being adopted or reunited with their biological families. They also make up a large proportion of youth who are involved in the juvenile justice system and on probation. Transitional youth "age out" of foster care through emancipation or because they reach the age of no longer being eligible for foster care services.

Within the foster care system, the ideal age for placement or even adoption is 0-3 years old. Unfortunately, as a child gets older, the more difficult it is to place them with a loving resource (foster) family. The TAY

population has also been stereotyped as the invisible community who come with too many challenges to manage. However, when you think about yourself as a teenager or maybe you have your own teenager didn't you or don't they still need love, structure, guidance, and support regardless of their age?

I guess I was considered one of the lucky ones when I was adopted at the age of 2years old. But when my adoptive mother died in my early 20s, I felt abandoned and all alone. I'm sure it was nothing close to what a transitional-age-youth feels. For me, in my 20s, I was considered a young adult and presumably should've had things figured out, but I didn't. We surely can't expect the same for youth dealing with adversity, especially as they continue to be lost in a system that caters toward the school-to-prison pipeline and then homelessness. Instead, there needs to be a call to action for the TAY population to end the revolving door and disrupt the system by providing hope, encouragement, opportunities, confidence, and empowerment. Non-profit organizations like Kids in the Spotlight and the Nehemiah Project LA do just that.

Nehemiah Project LA is a nonprofit organization that creates awareness of the challenges that an at-risk and transitioning foster youth experience. The founder of the Nehemiah Project LA, Bishop Ed Smith,

#### Significance of Foster Care

As we enter May, the National Foster Care Month, let's all make a difference to last a lifetime! "Every child dreams of a family, so is every soul longing for love." Why wait? Foster a child, Foster a future. Foster Care is a 24-hour home-like atmosphere in which a minor child who cannot be with his or her parents for some reason is provided a safe and stable environment. The place can be a ward, group home, or private home under the responsibility of a state-certified foster parent. This placement is usually done either by the government or a social service agency. Benefits of this system are multifold. Children remain in a home-like or family setting along with their siblings (if any), attend community schools, experience family holidays and events, form social relationships, and gain individualized attention. Foster Care is a nurturing temporary support, NOT a substitute for parents.

#### How it works?

In many cases, foster care acts as a forever home. The end goal for foster parents is to encourage family reunification. This means that the biological parents can take time to resolve their struggles and get their lives back on track for the sake of their children. Unlike adoption, there are no restrictions for parents and children to meet each other.

Here are few statistics about foster care:

- Children are due to negligence, substance abuse and inability to cope up.
- Majority of children are from White, African American, and Hispanic ethnicities.
- 40% of the children go to only 1 foster care support environment.

- 45% of children are supported by non-relatives, followed by 30% of relatives.
- Youth who leave foster care become homeless for the next 1-2 years.

60% of girls become pregnant within a few years of leaving.

Children and teens in foster care need YOU! Yes, you can change a life. Criteria to become a Foster Parent:

- ✓ Must be at least 21 years of age (any gender, or marital status)
- ✓ No criminal background
- ✓ Must be employed or steady monthly income
- ✓ Have a home (own or rental) meeting the licensing requirements
- ✓ Have a home study completed
- Exhibit emotional stability, physical health, reasonable discipline, and supervising ability.

If you are approved, you will receive training and payments to help you meet the daily needs of the child or children placed in your care along with medical coverage.

# FACTS AND HISTORY OF THE HOT AIR BALLOON

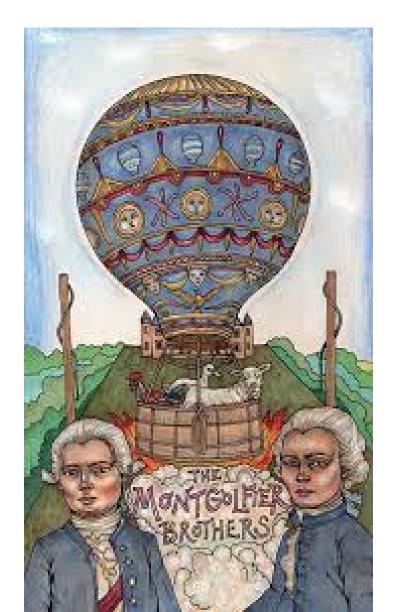
June 5th is National Hot Air Balloon Day, an annual celebration that marks the impact hot air balloons have had on travel and leisure. The hot air balloon is the oldest form of flight technology used for carrying humans. Many are intrigued by the bright colors and spectacular view of these balloons as if magically floating in the sky.

The Montgolfier Brothers, Joseph-Michel and Jacques-Étienne were the inventors of the first hot air balloon that safely carried people into the sky and back to land. In 1777, Joseph was inspired by laundry drying over a fire that formed pockets of air and raised laundry upwards to make a flying machine. He noted that smoke had a special gas with a special property called "levity" that can lift things up in the air (historyofballoons.com).

The brothers held the first public presentation of a hot air balloon in the Annonay area of France in front of a group of dignitaries on June 4, 1783. The balloon crossed 2km (1.24 miles), its flight lasted 10 minutes and its maximum altitude was 2,000m (6561.68 feet).

After flights with animals and unmanned balloons had been experimented with, the first hot air balloon flight with humans occurred on the 15th of October, in 1783. Jean-Francois Pilatre de Rozier was the first person to take a hot air balloon flight, a French chemistry and physics teacher and one of the first pioneers of aviation (www.daysoftheyear.com/days/hot-air-balloon-day/).

In 1794, the first use of hot air balloons in the military occurred. This was during the battle of Fleurus whereby the first use of a hot air balloon was used for observation purposes. Hot-air balloons have been used for meteorological purposes, military surveillance, and even mail and package delivery services. The hot air balloons we see today have been created in so many different shapes, including commercial products that have been used to advertise businesses.



Today, the balloons are mostly used for recreational purposes, to include competitive sporting events to set new hot air balloon racing records. The first Atlantic crossing occurred in 1987, with the first Pacific crossing coming four years later. The first trip around the world happened in 2002 when Steve Fossett made the trip.

The balloon itself consists of an envelope, which is used to contain the hot air, and a gondola, where passengers and a means of creating hot air are typically housed. The heated air inside the envelope has a lower density than that of the cold air outside, and this causes the balloon to rise.

Hot air balloon festivals are held annually throughout the year, allowing hot air balloon operators to gather – and serve as a great opportunity for spectators to admire and take rides, whereby the balloon is secured to the ground with tethered ropes.

Can you guess where is the most famous hot air balloon festival? Featuring more than 500 balloons, the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta in New Mexico is the world's premier ballooning event, takes place every October. The mass ascension takes place at Balloon Fiesta Park's 78-acre launch field — the equivalent of 54 football fields. Most balloon flights take place between April and October. The best weather for hot air balloon flying is blue skies, light winds, and little or no rain. Strong winds and heavy rain make it too dangerous to fly, and too risky for pilots. The best time of day for hot air balloons to fly is in the early morning when weather conditions are the most stable. Early morning typically provides the best chance for good weather allowing for cool temperatures. 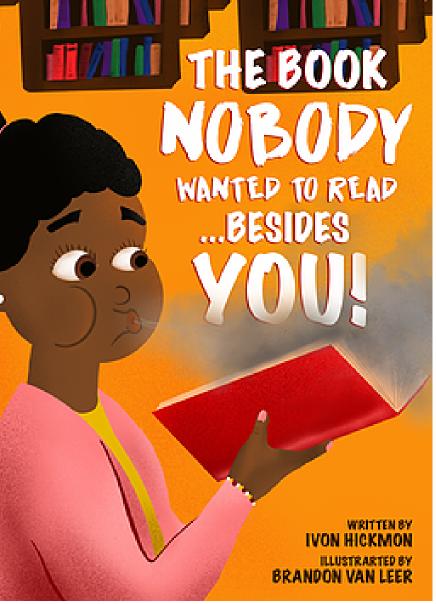

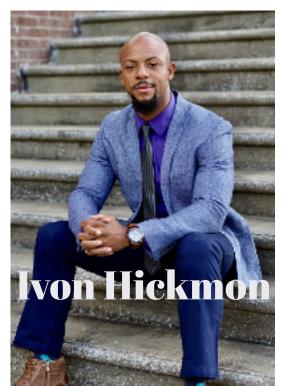

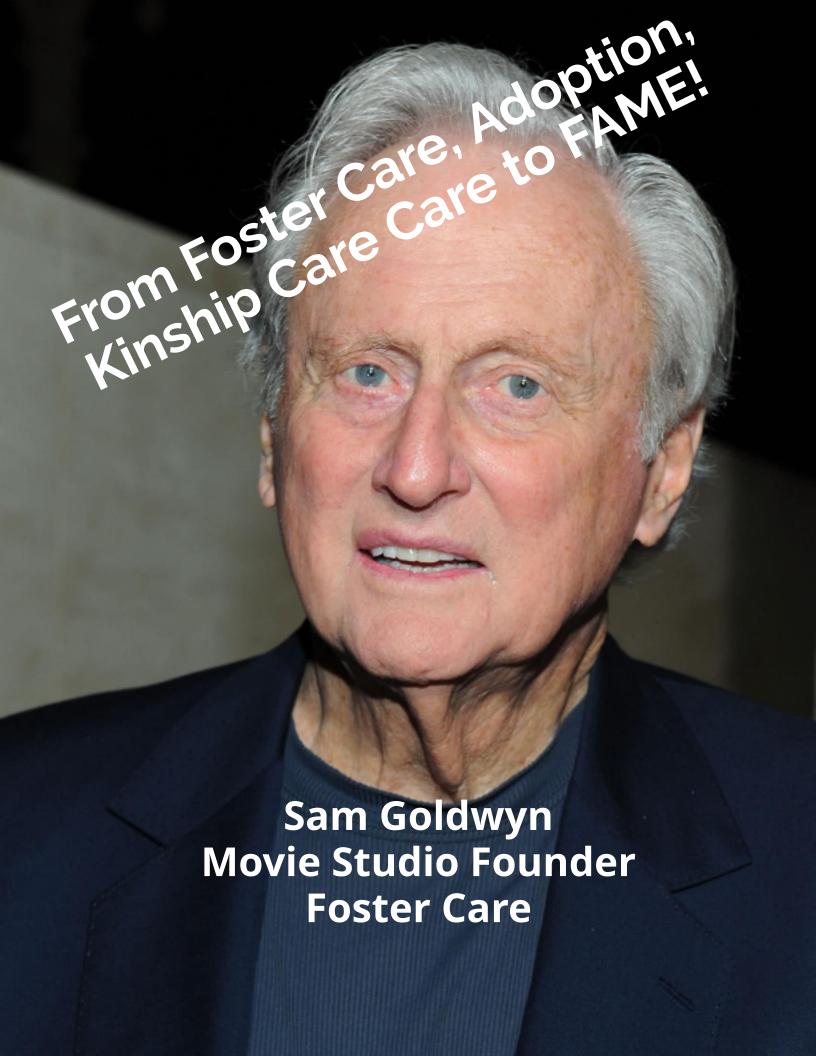

Catch them being good and make a big deal out of it. It's like smiling at someone. It's hard not smiling back. Find fun things to do with them and reward them often for doing the right thing. But, stay prayed up.

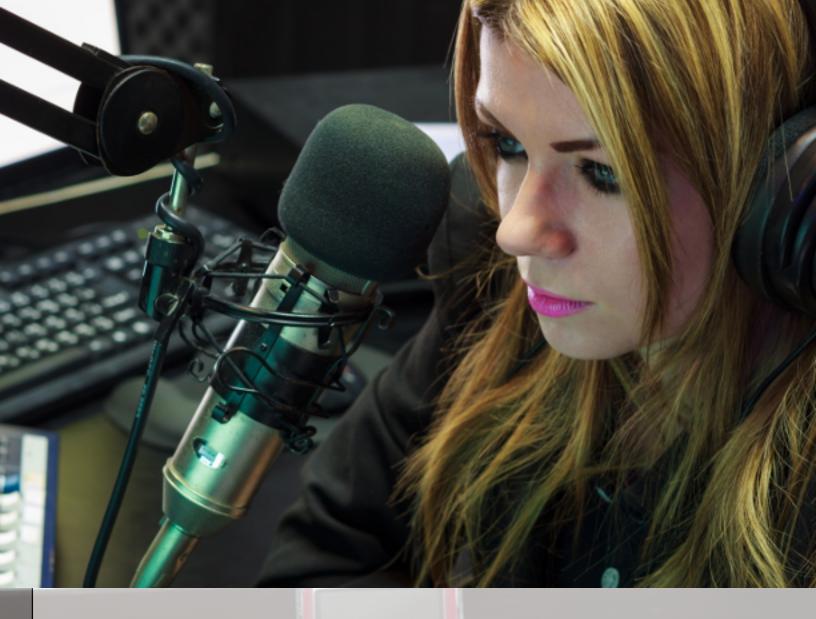
